July was a month to remember! We had a record number of temperatures of 108 or higher. Two days in a row the temperature was 114. In July 1985, the high was 117. Last year, in Zions Park, the staff taught visitors to take the heat seriously by baking cookies on the hood of a car. Now we know why many residents in Southern Utah head north and take cool vacations.

Despite these extreme hot conditions, Santa Clara residents and other large crowds in Southern Utah, enjoyed Independence Day and Pioneer Day celebrations.

After the fireworks ended on July 24th, many of us were rudely awakened by a huge and very loud thunderclap. The biggest storm of July. Flash flood warnings continued all through the night and into the next morning.





Besides the summer heat, storm, and flash floods, we were shaken up by three recent earthquakes. On July 17th some people felt the first earthquake that was said to register at 2.8 on the Richter scale. On July 28, many people reported feeling the earthquake that registered 4.5 on the Richter scale with the epicenter about 18 miles south of Cedar City. On July 29th, there was another slight earthquake in the same area which was 1.8 on the Richter scale. Perhaps that was an aftershock. But the residents of Santa Clara were a little shaken by all this unusual activity. The last time we felt an earthquake in this area was the summer of 1992.

One of the favorite places for Santa Clara Residents to visit is our historic district. The next generation is taking over Frei Market and Frei's Fresh Market where you can buy fresh fruits and vegetables this time of year. Santa Clara is well known for our historic district and attracts many visitors. Landon and Wanda Frei started their farm and fruit stand adventure back in 1956. The John Henry Graf and Barbara Staheli Graf house has been beautifully restored by the Vicki Frei Lasswell family. It is now being used as a kitchen and office for the fruit stand. Mandy was the first-born girl of the Swiss Company in Santa Clara, who lived in this house for many years.

WATER EFFICIENT LANDSCAPE PROGRAM

Ready to convert your grass to a water-efficient landscape?

The Washington County Water Conservancy District will rebate property owners for each square foot of grass removed and replaced with water efficient landscaping.

Rebate amounts

- \$2.00 per square foot up to 5,000 square feet
- \$1.00 per square foot for more than 5,000 square feet
- Minimum of 300 square feet to qualify

After your application is submitted, you must participate in a pre-conversion site visit. Starting your project prior to application approval and a pre-conversion site visit will make your conversion ineligible.
