Santa Clara City Mayor & Council Message

As I pondered what to talk about in the newsletter article this month, I found myself revisiting some Christmas Season newsletters I prepared over the past 18 years serving as Mayor. I found one that reminded me of a past challenging time for the city. The following newsletter was shared with residents at Christmas following the September 2012 dike failure and devastating flood. I've included some comments showing that Christmas Wishes sometimes do come true, call it a visit from the Ghost of Christmas Past...

The Christmas Season is upon us. Children throughout the City are making their Christmas Wish Lists for Santa. It's hard not to get caught up in the spirit of giving, or at least in the spirit of wishing anyway. Not to be left out, the mayor has a Christmas Wish List as well this year.



- I wish the Tuachan Wash Detention Basin was rebuilt and fully operational, then maybe the residents of the neighborhoods below the dam would sleep peacefully in their beds this Christmas Eve while sugar plums danced in their heads instead of plastic flood wall units and sandbags decorated their front yards. The City finished the replacement project the following September using federal disaster relief and flood control authority funds. Residents and businesses rebuilt and its hard to tell it ever happened now...
- 2. I wish the Chapel Street Landslide was stabilized, so the families who live in the area could enjoy the Christmas Holidays waiting for Santa to fall down their chimneys instead of their property falling down the troublesome hillside. *The City received a disaster mitigation grant in 2016 to fund the purchase of homes, property and relocation of residents whose homes were being damaged by the landslide...*
- 3. I wish the Town Hall Building was paid for, and the City Budget was free of the annual bond payments which tend to keep the City Council up late worrying about future budget cuts and revenue increases needed to satisfy the debt; not unlike parents wondering how to pay for the costs of Christmas. *The Harmons Commercial District has developed increasing sales tax revenues to the city from \$565,398 in 2012 to \$1,943,587 expected this year. This increase in revenues to the General Fund provide critical funding to make bond payments for the new building, fund the full-time fire & police departments, improve parks & trails and many other important projects within the city. Santa Claus is real...*
- 4. I wish the erosion protection work was complete along the Santa Clara River and the river management plan was fully funded to provide a safe and environmental responsible means to protect life and property along the river. Additional rock floodwall erosion protection improvements have been installed along the river and continue to be extended and maintained to protect residents and property from the risks of living along the river...
- 5. I wish the Heights Waterline Replacement Project was finished and the street pavements replaced, so Santa could get to those homes without a four-wheel drive sleigh. The Heights Project was completed in 2013. Since that time the city has built new traffic signals and bridges; and rebuilt many of the unimproved roads in the valley including the recently completed Vineyard Drive Project. The city has plans to continue these important public service improvements in the future...
- 6. I wish the federal government would consider the impacts of additional federal regulations on local government when it comes to power generation and water supplies. Maybe then power and water costs would come down so rates could be decreased. What a wonderful Christmas that would be for every household in the city. *I admit I was kind of naive with this wish, shooting for the moon, I guess. Consider it a reminder to never give up hope this time of year, keep wishing and maybe someday...*

These are just some of the things on the Mayor's Christmas list this season. It may look a little daunting but it's real and each item is a very real problem the city is trying to cope with at this time. But even now, there is so much more to be grateful for, so many blessings in the form of a caring population willing to give of their time, talents and resources to help their neighbors; a gifted City Staff dedicated to the people they serve; a highly qualified City Council who care about this place we call home and who try to make the right decisions all of the time. *Every year we accomplish a lot, it's important to be grateful for our blessings and the people who make things happen...*

It would be wonderful if Santa left us with a stocking full of solutions to the problems on our wish list, but even if he doesn't, this place is still one of the greatest places to live on earth and we can make do by continuing to work hard and doing good things. The city still has challenges, from housing shortages to pickleball conflicts, but if we continue to work together, we can keep this a great place to live...

Merry Christmas Santa Clara, I hope you each get everything on your wish list.

Water no more than 1x a week

To help conserve water during the cozy season, reduce your watering to no more than once a week from November through February. This adjustment will provide your landscape with the essential water it needs while helping Washington County conserve millions of gallons of water each month. By making this small change, you'll not only support the health of your yard, but also play a part in the regions ongoing water conservation efforts!



Ready to convert your grass to a water-efficient landscape?

The Washington County Water Conservancy District will rebate property owners for each square foot of grass removed and replaced with water efficient landscaping.

Rebate amounts

- \$2.00 per square foot up to 5,000 square feet
- \$1.00 per square foot for more than 5,000 square feet
- Minimum of 300 square feet to qualify

After your application is submitted, you must participate in a pre-conversion site visit. Starting your project prior to application approval and a pre-conversion site visit will make your conversion ineligible.
