In accordance with UCA 20a-5-101(4), notice is hereby given that the Municipal General Election will be held on Tuesday, November 4, 2025.

A polling location/vote center for ALL Municipalities holding General Elections will be held at the following locations:

Dixie Convention Center, 1835 Convention Center Drive, St George UT

Hurricane Community Center, 63 South 100 West, Hurricane, UT

Polls will be open from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. for voters to return their ballots or vote in person on Election Day.

Please note:

Only active voters who are currently registered in the municipalities that are having a general election and have not selected to vote in person will receive a ballot by mail.

Electronic marking devices will be available at each vote center to assist voters with sight and mobility issues. Individuals with disabilities who are not able to vote a manual ballot by mail, may obtain information on voting in an accessible manner from the County Clerk's office.

Voters must be a citizen of the United States; residents of the voting precinct in which they are voting; and 18 years of age or older by the General Election in order to participate. Voter identification will be required.

Registration by provisional ballot will be available.




Ben's commitment to Santa Clara extends beyond business. He dedicated 12 years to the local Little League board—five as president



WATER EFFICIENT LANDSCAPE PROGRAM

FUNDING ADDED TO FURTHER INCENTIVE GRASS REPLACEMENT

Residents of Santa Clara City now have an added reason to replace their lawns with water-wise landscaping. Through a new partnership with the Washington County Water Conservancy District (district), the city is offering an additional \$1 per square foot—up to 500 square feet—on top of the district's existing \$2 per square foot incentive available through the Water Efficient Landscape Program.

The city committed \$82,000 for the added incentive. When combined with matching state funds, the \$164,000 in supplemental funds will support more than 320 conversion projects in the city. Each new applicant from Santa Clara will be guaranteed the supplemental payment until the funds are exhausted.

"By contributing funding to the grass replacement program, we're investing in long-term water security," said Santa Clara City Mayor Rick Rosenberg. "This commitment of city resources reflects our determination to save water today and ensure a reliable supply for generations to come."

"Santa Clara's leadership sets an example worth following," said Doug Bennett, district conservation manager. "This kind of support from the region's cities is what's driving the success of the program." Since 2023, the district's program has helped the region's property owners replace nearly 3 million square feet of grass making it one of the nation's top performing programs on a per capita basis.

Community Safety Update: Staying Safe This Season

As the days grow shorter and the weather becomes cooler, it's a great time to review a few safety tips to keep our homes, families, and neighborhoods secure. Whether it's adjusting to the time change, staying warm safely, or preparing for the holidays, a little prevention can go a long way.

Safety on the Roads – Day and Night

Taking a few extra precautions can enhance safety on the road:

- Slow down and stay alert, watch for pedestrians and cyclists, especially during dawn and dusk hours.
- As the temperatures drop, please take a few extra minutes to clear all frost from your windows before driving.

- Check outdoor lighting. With darker evenings, ensure pathways and entryways are well lit to prevent trips and deter unwanted visitors.

Neighborhood Safety - Watch Out for Each Other

Our community stays safest when we stay connected:

- Report suspicious activity promptly to local authorities
- Join or start a neighborhood watch to strengthen communication within your community.
- Keep yards and sidewalks clear of debris and well-lit to reduce hiding spots.
- Check in on elderly or vulnerable neighbors, especially during cold snaps or power outages.

Holiday Safety - Celebrate with Care

The holidays are a time of joy, but also a time for extra caution:

- Inspect holiday lights for frayed cords and use only indoor-rated or outdoor-rated strands as appropriate.
- Be cautious with candles, use battery-operated versions when possible.
- Package deliveries can attract thieves; consider using delivery lockers or asking a neighbor to collect your packages
 if you'll be away.
- If traveling, set timers on lights and ask someone to check your home periodically.


Our last two kittens this year!
